Hello St. Paul Family,

I want to begin by saying how truly thankful and encouraged I am by each of you.

Lately, I have been so overjoyed seeing what God is doing in our church. There has been a genuine sense of the Holy Spirit moving among us through our worship, through the Word, and through the way we are showing up for one another. As I continue to seek the Lord and faithfully share what He lays on my heart, I have seen such a beautiful willingness in you to receive it, engage with it, and live it out.

That is not something I take lightly.

Our Lenten midweek services have been such a blessing, and the same is true for our Saturday and Sunday gatherings. We have seen new faces walk through the doors, and even more encouraging, we have seen hearts that are open, expectant, and hungry for what God is doing. There is a growing joy and excitement in our church, and it is evident!

One of the ways we have already begun leaning into that is through our Week of Prayer and Fasting leading up to Easter. It has been such a powerful time of drawing near to the Lord together. Each morning, I have had the privilege of sitting in the sanctuary, praying, meditating on His Word, and lifting up the needs that people have brought in. What has been especially encouraging is that you have been showing up. Many have come in seeking the Lord, laying things before Him, and interceding for others. It is a beautiful reminder that before we go out, we first draw near to His presence, to His heart, and to His leading.

As we celebrate Easter and reflect on the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, my encouragement is simple. Let us not leave that truth at Easter.

Jesus came for you.
He lived for you.
He died for you.



And He rose again so that you could have life.

That truth is not just something we remember once a year. It is something that shapes how we live every single day.

Whether you have been walking with Jesus for 40 years or just began your journey yesterday, we all stand on the same foundation. We are sinners in need of a Savior, and we are recipients of immeasurable, amazing grace.

So let us continue to walk in that grace.

My prayer for all of us is that we would daily surrender to the Lord, not out of guilt or pressure, but out of love. That following Jesus would not just be something we say, but something reflected in how we live, whether at home, at work, at school, at the grocery store, at a sporting event, and everywhere in between. That is where real faith is lived out.

Church, I am so grateful for you. Thank you for your faithfulness, your heart to serve, and your love for one another. It is a joy to walk alongside you.

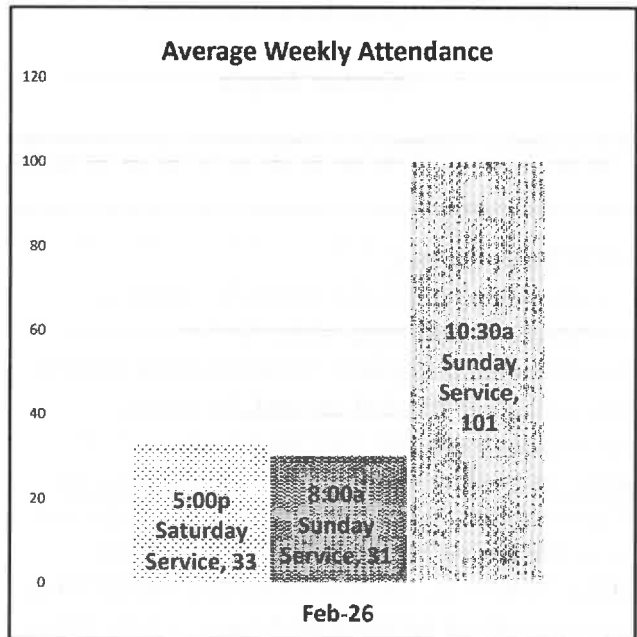
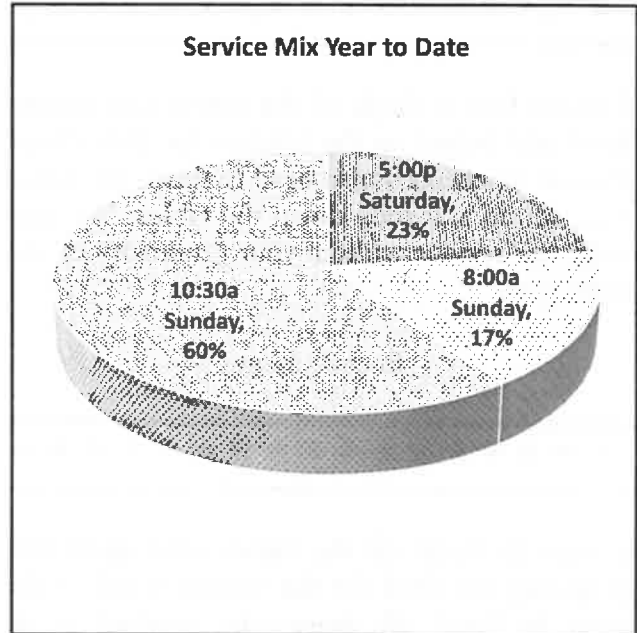

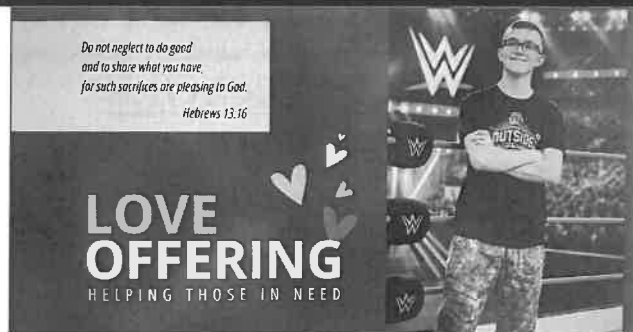

Love Offering Collection

We are collecting a “Love Offering” in support of Maverick Salazar who is a member here. Maverick was born with hypoplastic left heart syndrome. His first open heart surgery was at 4 days old, and then 8 months, and then 2 years old. At 8 years old he needed a pacemaker and in 2024 needed surgery to replace it.

He is now 19 years old. In December 2025 he went into atrial fibrillation. After further testing he was told he now needs a combined heart and liver transplant.

Since birth he has been treated at The University of Michigan Hospital and for this transplant was sent for an evaluation to the Cleveland Clinic and is now being scheduled to go to Duke University Hospital in Durham, North Carolina for evaluation, searching for a hospital willing to take on his complex case.

On top of this, he just found out that before you can be listed for a heart and liver transplant, he will need his wisdom teeth pulled, which needs completed at U of M Hospital because he needs cardiology anesthesia.

All of this means extended travel, long hospital stays, months away from normal life and ongoing medical expenses before and after surgery.

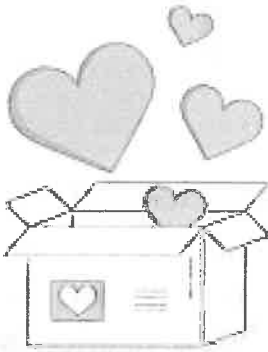
Our purple “Love Offering” containers will be at each entrance and we will be collecting through Sunday, April 19th.

LOVE PACKAGES



Do you have older Bibles or religious materials-books, paperbacks, magazines, daily devotionals, CDs, DVDs, Biblical puzzles & games, puppets, nativity sets, or anything that helps teach the gospel-just sitting around because you're not sure what to do with them? We have a plan the company Love Packages collects all these items, sorts them by category & sends them overseas to share the word of God.

We will begin collecting these items in the Parish Hall April 6th There will be a container marked as such. We will end the collection May 1st We have a volunteer who will drive our donations to their collection point in Delaware, Ohio.

Love Packages started in Butler, IL and has a 2nd location in Decatur, AL. Once the materials are sorted, they are shipped overseas in a 20-ton container. Monetary donations are accepted to maintain and expand the ministry. The priority is to pay for the container expenses. There are also "unseen" costs for fuel and truck expenses to pick up the donations from publishers and other ministries. They note the most important element is to pray because the ministry is depending on God, not people.

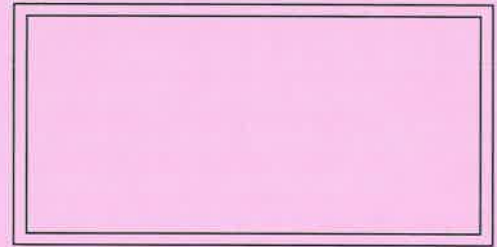
